Internship placements are competitive and not guaranteed. - Due to timetabling conflicts, PHIL1011 Introductory Logic and the ICPU Interdisciplinary Project cannot be taken with any other classes (students taking these classes must enrol in one class only) <p>Detailed class timetables for the program are generally available one month prior to arrival in Australia.</p>

5	Accommodation	<p>Students can apply for guaranteed accommodation with Queen Mary Building. Accommodation information will be provided to students soon after receiving an offer letter for the programme. The guarantee is subject to completing an application process by the deadline set for the program and acceptance of terms and conditions of the building.</p> <p>Queen Mary Building (QMB) is USyd's featured on-campus accommodation option and always a popular option for students. Enjoy the benefits of your own single room with access to shared bathrooms on each floor, together with lots of opportunities to socialise with your fellow students. After you receive and accept the EduRec offer for the programme. <p>Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.</p> <p>For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department before applying for the programme.</p> <p>Students may map up to a maximum of 10 Units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 Units for summer programmes. Beyond 12 Units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For details, visit the Registrar's Office website. Note: Course mapping request is subjected to approval from the Faculties.</p>

8	Visa Application	<p>Students may enter Australia with a Visitor Visa. Please check the visitor visa type applicable for your nationality. Singaporean students should apply for the Electronic Travel Authority visa (subclass 601).</p> <p>Students should obtain a valid visa before making any travel arrangement for their summer programme. It is recommended to prepare and submit the visa application as soon as the necessary documents from the host university are available.</p>
9	Travel Advisories	<p>Visit the MFA website for travel advisories on various countries from the Singapore government.</p>
10	Student Insurance	<p>NUS students will be eligible for coverage under the NUS Travel Insurance for approved study abroad programmes, including this programme.</p> <p>Details of the insurance is available at: https://www.nus.edu.sg/uhc/billing-insurance/student-insurance#student</p> <p>Students are responsible for ensuring that they have sufficient travel insurance coverage.
